



**New product developed by Laboratoria Smeets for the treatment of Osteoarthritis.**  
**Clinical case study for Afghan Hound**

Khallis Y-Shirvan is an Afghan hound of thirteen months old and weighing 33 kg. At the age of three months, he had a very stable forehand. At the age of six months and three weeks, he is the owner returned to the breeder, <http://www.y-shirvan.com>, with a very weak, unstable forehand (meager, elbows and feet inwards and outwards narrow in the chest).
